

NEW EDITOR FOR THE JOURNAL

From January next year Hugh L Williams will take over as Editor of the *British Reformed Journal*. Hugh is already known to readers having contributed a major review of the recently published English language edition of the first volume of Turretin's *Institutes of Elenctic Theology* in Issue 3 (July–September 1993) of the *Journal*.

Hugh grew up in a Welsh mining village and trained as a mining surveyor. With the collapse of the mining industry he turned his hand to classics and studied Greek and Hebrew at Bangor University. Following that he spent a number of years in the field of education where he was a teacher in schools in Northampton and Leicester. He is now semi-retired and teaches part-time, concentrating on children with learning difficulties.

For some years he has had a burden for the defence and propagation of the Reformed faith, particularly in England. His burden and vision will doubtless manifest itself in the new *Journal*, as will his scholarly capabilities and deep spirituality.

Among his other writings are a series of three articles entitled "Presbyterianism: Whither Goest Thou?" published in *The Presbyterian* magazine, Issues 28–30 (September 1989 – January 1990).

The British Reformed Fellowship welcomes Hugh as the new Editor of its *Journal* and urges all readers and friends to remember him in prayer as he seeks to discharge his duties to the honour of our glorious Saviour.
